- I. Call to Order: The ADA Committee meeting of Los Angeles World Airports was called to order at 1:15 p.m. by acting chairperson, Myrna Cabanban.
- II. Introductions/Roll Call: It was established that a quorum was present

III. Consent Calendar:

The minutes for June 2018, and January 2019 were in the consent calendar. Ms. Harmon moved to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. McGlynn. The consent calendar was approved.

IV. Public Comments:

No public comments at this time.

V. Chairperson Report:

No Chairperson report at this time.

VI. Committee Objectives:

(This is item 5 on the agenda) The Chairperson reported that the committee had identified a public event to coincide with Disability Awareness Month in October, as the number one priority. Number 2 is work with a university on doing a travelers with disabilities survey at LAX. Number 3; hold a forum on disability travel issues faced by persons with disabilities at LAX and in general. Number 4; fill the current positions that are vacant on the committee. Number 5, work with airport police on a disability event similar to the one in the summer of 2017. Number 6, sponsor a bimonthly get acquainted tour for persons with disabilities at the airport. This would give people with severe disabilities the opportunity to experience the airport environment.

Mr. McGlynn suggested that persons making decisions on closures and rerouting of traffic also take pedestrians into consideration when rerouting traffic. The needs of persons with

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28 29 disabilities need to be taken into consideration when rerouting is being planned. It should be a goal of the committee to make sure this is being done.

Ms. Goldkorn suggested that one of the committee's goals might be having a program or event to advance the visibility of LAX, advance the innovations of LAX, and the opportunities at LAX for not just the disability community but for everyone, because if you're doing it for us, you're doing it for everyone.

Mr. Rolon proposed a possible agenda for a public forum. He said he would present a more detailed plan at next month's meeting.

Mr. Rolon stated that he spoke to Prof. Steve Barth at USC last week. He told the professor that one of the things lacking is a survey that looks at the needs of travelers with disabilities. We understand the general public as they journey through the airport, but we do not understand travelers with disabilities and their experience and needs. Ideally, the survey would be done in the summer and the results would be presented in October during a public event.

The Chairperson stated that some of the students from USC who have been working with LAWA had been contacting committee members for input. The Chairperson explained that she told the students they need to expand their sampling of persons with disabilities a little bit more. Based on their presentation to the committee, they were just looking at specific experiences of one or two people – generalizing the data from that which didn't quite represent the larger community [with disabilities]. The students were very receptive.

Ms. Goldkorn feels that the program [at USC] is going to grow, and suspects the professor was quite surprised at the level and the depth, breadth of knowledge, and information sharing and collaboration that committee members have of the disability community.

The Chairperson said "I think if we focus their energy and their mindset it really would be to our benefit."

The Chairperson told members that October is coming right up. She would like to see something really big in October, something that will show off LAWA. We need to start planning for this now.

VII. By-Laws Review and Vote.

(This is item 6 on the agenda). Ms. Goldkorn moved to approve the by-laws. The motion was seconded by Mr. McGlynn. The Chairperson called for discussion. After clarifications, and minor grammatical edits, Ms. Goldkorn entertained a friendly amendment to approve the by-laws as amended. The motion was made by Mr. McGlynn, and seconded by Ms. Guevara. The motion to approve the by-laws as amended passed.

VIII. Year End Statistics.

(This is item 7 on the agenda) Mr. Rolon reported that in 2018, there were over 1.5 million requests for wheelchair service. It is believed that in the international terminal, 40% of wheelchair requests were fake, while in the domestic terminal the figure is around 25% Using the estimate of \$45 per average push, the cost to airlines for fake

pushes exceeded \$20 million in 2018 at LAX. Fake animals claiming to be service animals are in the increase too.

There was discussion on wheelchair service abuse and he problems it causes for legitimate people who need wheelchairs.

Mr. McGlynn pointed out that the airlines at TBIT are concerned about LAWA's desire to have white courtesy phones that passengers can pick up and request a wheelchair. So there's concern that signs will go up that say "Need a wheelchair? Pick up the phone." People who need wheelchairs are going to be disadvantaged even worse because there are going to be all these people that say, "yea, I could use a wheelchair."

Ms Goldkorn pointed out that "it is only going to get worse because the opportunity to fly, the availability of flights, the expansion of airports and services are tremendous. And so, this problem is only going to get bigger."

 The Chairperson stated that the problem is going to increases. There will be increased demand as more abled bodied individuals abuse the intent of the wheelchair service. The problem is that people do not have to provide proof that they need a wheelchair. People who really need wheelchair service can be at a disadvantage because we can't serve them in a timely manner on account of the fakers .

The chairperson added that every time we hear the numbers [of abusers] it gets more and more incredible. We will wait for Larry's final numbers in April.

IX. LAMP Report.

There were no TSA representatives present at the meeting. No TSA report was given.

X. TSA Report.

There was no TSA report.

XI. LAWA Projects Report.

There was nothing to report.

XII. LAXPD Report.

There was no LAXPD Report. Mr. Rolon reported that Ofr. Alejandres was out of the area on special assignment.

XIII. City Attorney Report.

City Attorney's Office has nothing to report.

XIV. Customer Service Report.

Mr. Rolon reported that there would be no Customer Service Report. Ms. Willard transferred from that office.

XV. Emergency Management Report.

Mr. Rolon reported that Ms. Welch was away. He asked the committee members if they know anyone who would like to volunteer to participate as a victim at the AirEx, to notify Brandy.

 Mr. Rolon reported that the office continues to receive inquiries about services provided by airlines, but continue to be told that the airline does not provide the service when they call the toll free number.

Mr. McGlynn asked if the matter has been brought to the attention of the airlines?

Mr. Rolon responded that he has brought the matter to the attention of airline executives at conferences in the past, and has made mention of the problem to airlines at TBITEC airline meetings before. He said he will be preparing a general advisory for the community on the matter.

He worked with Air France to accommodate the special accommodation needed by a passenger traveling to France for surgery.

Mr. Rolon reported on the FAA Appropriation Bill that passed Congress in October 2018. He then went on to report on provisions of the bill on disabilities.

Mr. Rolon reported that DOT is creating an Air Carrier Access Act Committee to advice the Secretary of Transportation on matters of disability and the Air Carrier Access Act. The committee will also look at changing the rules that apply to service animals and comfort animals.

Mr. Rolon reported that the committee would be receiving a proposed brochure on wheelchair travel for their review and comment.

He reported that 67 airport community members attended course trauma during disasters. The class was very well received, and was taught by Dr. Ana De La Torre from the L. A. County Mental Health Department.

Classes are planned for Los Angeles Fire Department personnel assigned to LAX on assisting disabled persons during emergencies at the airport.

Committee voted to adjourn at 2:35 p.m.
